Local News Briefs

Nash-Edgecombe Economic Development released an announcement that Head Start is accepting applications for the 2011-2012 Program Year.

The Good News... Waste Cleanup

The Environmental Protection Agency initiated an Emergency Response Action related to clean-up of a residential site in Rocky Mount.

The EPA initially received from the NC Department of Environment and Natural Resources an RCRA (Resource Conservation and Recovery Act) report regarding a residential/farm property. Multiple tractor trailers containing drums of unknown material were found at the site, with one of the trailers leaking.

The EPA responders have been working to clean up the property and remove any potentially hazardous materials — including five drums of Potassium FerroCyanide.

The Bad News... Cukes At Risk

Cucurbit downy mildew has been reported on cucumbers in North Carolina including Johnston and Wilson County. Cucurbits include cucumbers, squash, and melons.

Cucurbit downy mildew starts as pale green or yellow spots that make the plant appear mottled. If not treated, the spots merge and the leaves turn brown. The underside of leaves may be covered with a white or purple growth. Growers living near these counties should be watchful and prepare to treat the disease should it hit their crops.

A Little Local History

Person: Harold Dunbar Cooley (1897-1974)

A politician with the Democratic Party, Congressman Cooley represented the Fourth Congressional district of NC from the mid-1930s through 1967. He served as Chairman of the US House Committee on Agriculture from 1949 to 1952 and again from 1955 to 1967.

An NC Highway Historical Marker placed in Nashville NC draws attention to his significance in shaping postwar federal farm policy. Cooley was a driving force in developing President Franklin D. Roosevelt's agricultural program. Cooley backed reforms to provide for allotments, price supports, rural electrification, and soil conservation. Cooley also endorsed the "Food for Freedom" program. A quote attributed to Cooley states, "Bread and butter rather than bullets and bayonets are the most powerful weapons in our arsenal."

In addition to the highway historical marker, the Harold D. Cooley library in Nashville NC is named after Congressman Cooley.

Place: A North Carolina Legend

Located a few miles outside of Bennett NC is a small piece of land known as the Devil's Tramping Ground.

All that is visible is a barren circle in the forest, a bit off a beaten path. Nothing has grown, nor will grow, within the 40 foot ring. Even a US Geological Survey team could not find a scientific explanation for the lack of growth within the circle.

The Devil's Tramping Ground is one of North Carolina's oldest legends. One of the "legendary" explanations for the bare circle of ground is that the Devil spends his nights pacing around in a circle as he thinks of ways to torment human souls.

Things We Did in NC When We Were Bored

40th Independence Celebration Rocky Mount NC — July 3rd

The City of Rocky Mount's Independence Day celebration drew a large crowd on July 3rd. Held at the Rocky Mount Athletic Stadium, the crowd had plenty of room to play with footballs, toys, and the free frisbees given away during the event. Live bands and singers entertained the crowd for several hours. About a half dozen vendors provided snow cones, lemonade, and snacks for the thousands in attendance. After dusk, fireworks lit up the sky for more than 15 minutes, with a variety of sparkles from ground level to high in the sky. Traffic leaving the event was backed up briefly, and then cleared. This was a nice event. It would have been preferable for the fireworks to be over the stadium — as they were better viewed from the parking lot — and traffic at the end could have been better handled. Shades of Grey

What Do You Think?

Some situations are viewed in black and white; right and wrong. Yet, many people think situations also have a grey area where solutions are not so easily discerned.

Submitted for Your Consideration and Conversation

One evening you stop downtown to eat in one of your favorite restaurants, a place where you eat several times each month.

You have a good meal, pay at the counter, and decide to stay downtown a little longer and walk around.

Stopping by your car to feed the parking meter, you reach into your pocket to get change. Pulling out the change, you see that you don't have a quarter to pay for the meter. From the cost of your meal, you know you should have been given more change when you paid at the restaurant.

The following week, you decide to go back to eat. It is, after all, one of your favorite restaurants. Again you have a good meal and go to the register to pay. As you turn to leave the restaurant, you think of the previous visit and stop to count your change. It is a few cents short. Though you shrug it off and leave, you begin to wonder whether the short-changing was on purpose or accidental.

At the end of the month, you return to the same restaurant to have dinner with a friend. Once again when you pay for your meal at the counter, you are given less change than you should be given.

Knowing it has happened several times now, do you feel that you should mention your concern to the restaurant manager? Do you think that since it is just a few cents that it is easier to let it go? Would you feel embarrassed confronting the manager over such a small amount? What if the change is several dollars short? Does the amount make a difference, or is it the principle?

Alternatively, what if your friend was paying the bill? Would you advise your friend to count the change received? If so, do you feel you would be more willing to stand up for your friend than for yourself?

Finally, would you stop coming to the restaurant after the third time you were short-changed?

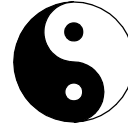

Something to Clip for Your 'Fridge

With the last space shuttle mission in progress, submitted for your scissors
this issue is an excerpt from President John F. Kennedy's special message
to Congress in 1961. Presented here with thanks to jfklibrary.org, whose
archive contains the full text.

Excerpt from President John F. Kennedy's Special Message To The Congress

May 25, 1961

"Since early in my term, our efforts in space have been under review. With
the advice of the Vice President, who is Chairman of the National Space
Council, we have examined where we are strong and where we are not,
where we may succeed and where we may not. Now it is time to take
longer strides--time for a great new American enterprise--time for this
nation to take a clearly leading role in space achievement, which in many
ways may hold the key to our future on earth.

"I believe we possess all the resources and talents necessary. But the
facts of the matter are that we have never made the national decisions or
marshalled the national resources required for such leadership. We have
never specified long-range goals on an urgent time schedule, or managed
our resources and our time so as to insure their fulfillment.

"Recognizing the head start obtained by the Soviets with their large
rocket engines, which gives them many months of leadtime, and
recognizing the likelihood that they will exploit this lead for some time to
come in still more impressive successes, we nevertheless are required to
make new efforts on our own. For while we cannot guarantee that we shall
one day be first, we can guarantee that any failure to make this effort will
make us last. We take an additional risk by making it in full view of the
world, but as shown by the feat of astronaut Shepard, this very risk
enhances our stature when we are successful. But this is not merely a race.
Space is open to us now; and our eagerness to share its meaning is not
governed by the efforts of others. We go into space because whatever
mankind must undertake, free men must fully share."

"... I believe that this nation should commit itself to achieving the goal,
before this decade is out, of landing a man on the moon and returning him
safely to the earth. No single space project in this period will be more
impressive to mankind, or more important for the long-range exploration
of space; and none will be so difficult or expensive to accomplish."
