Edgecombe and Nash counties and the City of Rocky Mount welcome the public to help plan the future of the twin county area. The Edgecombe County Board of Commissioners, the Nash County Board of Commissioners, and the Mayor and City Council of the City of Rocky Mount invite participation in "The Twin County Visioning & Strategic Planning Kick-Off" happening this month.

This kick-off meeting's goals include creating a vision for the Twin County future, identifying issues with public input, and taking the first steps at creating a road map for the next twenty years.

Speaking with Rocky Mount Assistant City Manager Ann Wall, she stated, "The meeting aims to get broad support for the vision of what the Twin County area can be." She also repeated a quote from management expert and author Peter Drucker, "The best way to predict the future is to create it." This is an important point they have in mind at City Hall as they prepare for this meeting and the planning to follow.

The NC Department of Transportation (NCDOT) continues work on the breaches on NC 12 caused by Hurricane Irene in August. Workers are laying asphalt with supplies ferried in — causing some tie-ups for motorists awaiting the ferry. NCDOT is working on the repairs, as well as organizing public workshops in December to discuss other possible permanent solutions to transportation issues in the area.


You and your companion head straight for electronics, and quickly reach a stack of the game systems — already half gone and with more people grabbing by the second.
