Rocky Mount City Manager Appoints New Police Chief

Rocky Mount City Manager Charles W. Penny announced the appointment of James C. Moore as Chief of Police for the City of Rocky Mount. Moore assumes his new role with the Rocky Mount Police Department on January 2nd.

"Following an extensive assessment, interview and selection process, Moore emerged as the ideal candidate for the next chief of the Rocky Mount Police Department," said Penny. "His impressive range of work experience coupled with his education, professional expertise, and community involvement make him uniquely qualified to lead the Rocky Mount Police Department."



Moore began his career in 1988 as a police officer with the Wilmington Police Department, where he rose through the ranks to his current position as Deputy Chief of Police, a post he has held for five years. As Deputy Chief, Moore leads three subordinate commanders and three police divisions in the Patrol Operations Bureau.

A native of the Wilmington area, Moore holds a bachelors degree in sociology from the University of North Carolina at Wilmington, where he also earned postgraduate certificates in project management and business administration. Moore is also an alumnus of the Municipal and County Administration Course and the Public Executive Leadership Academy, the FBI's National Academy in Quantico, VA, and the Administrative Officers Management Program at NCSU.

"I am pleased to accept this appointment as Police Chief for the City of Rocky Mount," said Chief Moore. "I look forward to working with the men and women of the Rocky Mount Police Department as we serve the Rocky Mount community."

The Good News... Holidays **Bring Families Together**

A Little Local History

Bennett Bunn Plantation

Driving down Route 97 outside Zebulon, a roadside sign announces the Bennett Bunn Plantation. The plantation's historic, Federal-architecture house was built by Bennett Bunn in 1833 on inherited family land, and was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1986.

The plantation consists of the historic home, barns, a log cabin, and many acres of farm land and forests.

Bennett Bunn was a well-known business man and farmer with properties in Franklin and Nash counties — including Zebulon and Rocky Mount areas.

The 178+ year old home and longterm family property was owned by generations of the Bunn family until 2000. The home and plantation are now a private property and residence, and can be viewed at their website, www.bennettbunn.com

The Bad News... Check Your Receipts

The NC Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services' Standards Division announced that stores throughout North Carolina were fined for price-scanning errors. Fines were levied on stores in Charlotte, Elkin, Garner, Micro, Raleigh, Salisbury, Selma, and Wilkesboro.

The NCDA&CS Standards Division conducts periodic, unannounced inspections of business price-scanner systems to check for accuracy between the prices advertised and the prices that ring up at the register. If a store has more than a 2 percent error rate on overcharges, inspectors discuss the findings with the store manager and conduct an intensive follow-up inspection at a later date. Undercharges are also reported, but do not count against a store.

"Consumers are watching their purchases closely and looking for sales in today's economy," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "By checking the accuracy of price-scanning systems in retail stores, we are helping to ensure that when shoppers get to the checkout counter, they get the advertised price. Consumers can contact our Standards Division at 919.733.3313 to register a complaint."

Shades of Grey

What Do You Think?

Some situations are viewed in black and white; right and wrong. Yet, many people think situations also have a grey area where solutions are not so easily discerned. This is not just about the choices people make, but the thought process they go through to arrive at their decisions.

You use social media sites to keep up with family and friends. Each evening, you check in to see what is going on with your cousins, aunts, friends, and others. You also share notes on your day and activities with your family.

One evening, you post a note about your fun day at the beach with your family. Several people respond, saying "how wonderful" and "what a great way to spend the day". One friend, however, makes a negative remark about how "crummy" they think that is for a vacation, adding "why don't you take your family someplace nice?"

You're a little taken aback. You've known this woman, Sally, for awhile — she's married to your husband's closest pal and has been to your home for dinner a couple times a year since they were married.

Looking back through the site at her information, you see that she has recently lost her job. You also see that she has posted several other negative comments on your photos that you hadn't seen before.

Speaking with your husband, he confirms he just heard about her getting fired from his pal. The two of you decide she might just be feeling negative, and you decide to remove her comments from your page and photos and say nothing to her.

A short while later, you post a photo of your family having a barbecue in the backyard. Within minutes, Sally has posted a very negative comment about your "lousy" grill, "ugly" clothes, and "fat people" food. You can feel yourself getting angry and you immediately delete her comment.

Do you think it likely you would immediately un-friend Sally? Would you stay quiet, say something to her, or have your husband talk with Sally's husband?




