One Year After the Tornado

On April 16, 2011, a tornado touched down in Wilson. It tore through a busy section of the town, knocked down trees, decimated several businesses, and damaged private property across a wide area before dissipating.

Several businesses near the junction of Tarboro Street and Forest Hills Drive were hit so badly that the buildings became uninhabitable. Worrell's Used Cars took a big hit, yet continued to do business from their location.

The Worrell dealership was so damaged that it had to be torn down. Two weeks after the tornado, a trailer was moved onto the site so that they could reopen. Then, they rebuilt. Ethelene Worrell says, "It took about six months to get everything together. We built a new building with a three-bay shop, and now we're back in business stronger than ever."

Storm cleanup took weeks, with the town gathering debris and yard waste and helping emergency aid reach those who needed it. Businesses repaired, or moved to new locations. Utilities repaired broken equipment and services returned to normal. Looking back a year later, little can be seen of the damage except for an empty lot and the new buildings along the path the tornado took through the town.
