## Commissioner's Food Safety Forum will Focus on New Federal Produce-Safety Rules

New federal rules governing produce safety will be among the topics at the eighth annual Commissioner’s Food Safety Forum on Tuesday, August 28th.

Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler will host the event from 9am to 12:30pm in the Expo Center at the State Fairgrounds. The event is open to farmers, food businesses, regulators, health professionals and others with an interest in food safety. Admission is free, and lunch will be provided.

“With passage of the federal Food Safety Modernization Act, producers and growers are anticipating the impending release of major rules and regulations regarding preventive measures and produce safety,” Troxler said. “Our agenda will focus on these rules in an effort to help prepare the industry for the changes.”

Keynote speakers will be Leanne Skelton, senior policy analyst with the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, and Dr. Liz Wagstrom, chief veterinarian for the National Pork Producers Council. Skelton’s presentation will focus on the new federal produce rules and the protective measures required by them. Wagstrom will speak about food safety issues in the meat industry.

Thomas Mack of Dole Food Co. and Bob Reinhard of the Hillshire Brands Co. will provide food-industry perspectives about the rules. And Ben Chapman, a food safety specialist at NC State University, will talk about food safety training for farmers markets. Troxler also will speak at the forum.

It is unclear exactly why we are receiving more reports. It could be the increased attention NASA has received in the public eye. It could be the increased name recognition that MUFON has receive because of the media attention. Some speculate that because Hollywood has focused so much on aliens, people are more likely to look skywards. No one knows for sure.

I have been an investigator for MUFON since May of 2011 and I can tell you that many North Carolinians are seeing things that defy conventional wisdom. People often ask me if there are hotspots in North Carolina. I answer by saying that we do receive a large number of reports in Wilmington, Asheville, Fayetteville and Charlotte. But I also have to say that I don’t believe UFOs are only in those cities. I just think these cities have more people willing to report their sightings. The North Carolina Highway Historical Marker Advisory Committee meets twice each year, to review applications and make decisions on placement of new historical markers.

One marker placed this year in the area commemorates Thelonious Monk. Located by the Booker T Theater in Rocky Mount, the marker is about 1 mile South of Mr. Monk’s birthplace. 

Preparing for the New  
School Year
