Aftermath of Sandy Reached Eastern NC

People across the nation are sending their help and hopes to coastal victims of Hurricane Sandy. The Hurricane caused damage along the NC coast before severely impacting New York and New Jersey.

Though Eastern NC mostly escaped the hurricane's destruction, local businesses were feeling after effects through November. Products and supplies needed by businesses in Knightdale, Wilson, and other areas were held up by the interruptions in shipping and trucking from hurricane impacted areas.

As things get closer to normal along the coast, delays in supplies should go away. Small shops have weathered this storm after the storm, and hopefully are filling their shelves and receiving needed supplies more regularly again.

The Good News...Bunn Planned Improvements

Guests at the Town Council meeting will know that some changes are coming to Bunn in the coming months.

With the waste water treatment plant running at 80% capacity, that capacity is being expanded by building of a 2nd waste water treatment plant. The Town secured a grant to help with related costs. The new plant will be set up near the correctional center and solar farm along Highway 39.

For pedestrian traffic, planned sidewalks should make the walk from Bunn high school to town easier going. Sidewalks will also be added from Bunn Manor to the intersection at Route 98, making it easier for Manor residents to walk or roll into town.

The Strange-ness

Multiple "red rains" have fallen on India since summertime. As recently as mid-November, these colored rains were still being reported. Residents in several cities in India have reported red rain and their concerns as to what may be causing the phenomenon — and whether the rainfall is safe. Some gathered samples to show and to send for testing. When gathered, rainwater looks like blood, often red, though browns and other colors have been recorded.



Colored rains are more frequent than one might think! Colored rain has been recorded throughout history and recorded in literature. Red rain has fallen in India, Sri Lanka, the UK, and other parts of the world many times over the past 100 years or so.

Scientific testing has helped analyze rains of more recent decades, removing some of the fear and superstition these rains brought throughout history. Scientific explanations vary from desert sand to red spores and algae blowing up and mixing with the rainfall. Yellow rains have been attributed to honeybees on several occasions.

Vocalist Billy Scott, most recently of Billy Scott & The Party Prophets, passed away Saturday, November 17th.

According to his band, Mr. Scott was battling pancreatic cancer from his Charlotte-area home. His band is currently holding several fundraisers to assist Scott's wife, Gail, with related medical expenses.

Small Town, Big Holiday Revelry By Frank & Kay Whatley

The Town of Wendell expects its nearly 6,000 town residents to be joined by thousands of visitors during December. With expansive lighting and decorative displays, Wendell's holiday cheer offers delight for individuals, families and shoppers from miles around.

Incorporated in 1903, Wendell NC sits between Zebulon and Knightdale along Route 64/264. In a city like Wilson or Rocky Mount, residents and visitors can find all the goods and services they need. Wendell, despite being a small town, also offers a variety of shops and personal services to provide what local families need (or want). From the independent grocer to downtown shopping to personal services and fresh farm goods, there are many locally-owned businesses providing for the town.

Founded in the mid-1800s by a group of farmers, the Town of Wendell drew it's name from Oliver Wendell Holmes. Early town structures stand to this day, with many of its old buildings in the National Register of Historic Places including two designated historic areas.

The Wendell Boulevard Historic District is a multiple-block area of Wendell is on the National Register of Historic Places. A number of historic homes may be seen by walking the district, which covers portions of Wendell Boulevard, Mattox Street, Old Zebulon Road, Buffalo Street. and Main

The Wendell Commercial Historic District is at the junction of Main Street and Third Street, and includes the old Bank of Wendell building currently occupied by Larry's Tailor Shop.

During 2012, several small businesses closed in Wendell, yet more have come and set up shop in downtown and along Wendell Boulevard. Speaking with one of the holiday organizers, she was pleased that this year more storefronts are full than during last year's holiday season.

As the holidays approach, the storefronts are alive with holiday colors. The Wendell Chamber of Commerce, downtown organizers, and merchants have joined forces to show off Wendell's spirit and make it a lively destination for holiday activities and shopping. Multiple shops offer antiques and unusual gifts. Is that special gift waiting on a shop shelf?

A large part of Wendell's Christmas offering this year is the Lake Myra Christmas Light Show. This display joins the town's planned visits by Santa and Mrs. Claus, the downtown Old Fashion Candy Store, Santa's mail box, and Main Street displays, Lake Myra Christmas is the largest computerized display in North Carolina. It includes the tallest computercontrol Christmas tree in the state of NC! At different times during the light show, visitors can see a magician or watch snow being made.

According to Producer, Don Williams, the main display is located at 210 East Fourth Street in Wendell. Two displays which will be lighted throughout December. Mr. Williams puts together the Lake Myra free 300,000 light display "because he loves Christmas."


