The Good News... Zebulon Boys & Girls Club New Facility

The Zebulon Boys & Girls Club provides classes, sports leagues, after school programs, and much more for area residents, and officially opens Monday, January 16th in its new facility with even more to offer.

Children not only come to play, but to learn. The club offers a variety of classes to sign up for, with the new expanded facility providing new space for league play, games, gardening. cooking, and more.

In prior years, the sports leagues traveled to use facilities at other clubs. With the new gym a local sports league is planned and travelling is no longer a necessity!

The new facility also expands the game room. The previous location only had space for one pool table, a foos-ball table, and a snack area. The new location includes three pool tables, three foos-ball tables, two ping pong tables, and two bumper pool tables.

Complete with a kitchen and raised bed gardens, the club can now provided expanded programs on nutrition, cooking, growing food, and more. Opportunities for new programs abound, and are expected to help them serve the children of the community more than ever. With help from outside groups, the offerings will increase far beyond what was possible in prior years.



Until now the Club served approximately 100 kids each day. They are now looking at 150 soon after opening and expansion to upwards of 200 per day.

The Zebulon Boys & Girls Club serve as an integral part of the local community, supporting families and providing local children with a safe place to play, learn, and grow.

RBC & PNC Merger

In June 2011, the PNC Financial Services Group, Inc. and Royal Bank of Canada announced that they had signed an agreement for PNC to acquire RBC Bank (USA), the US retail banking subsidiary of Royal Bank of Canada. PNC is expected to re-brand the RBC branches throughout NC.

Based in Pittsburgh PA, the PNC Financial Services Group, Inc. is one of the largest diversified financial services organizations in the US, providing retail banking, business banking, and residential mortgage banking. PNC also provides specialized services for corporations and government entities including corporate banking, real estate finance and asset-based lending. PNC services include wealth management and asset management.

Until this time, PNC has not had any offices or branches in NC — nor across the Southeastern NC. The new deal expands PNC into RBC's many branches across both Carolinas, Alabama, and Georgia.

PNC's plans include retaining the existing RBC operations center in Rocky Mount. Fred Solomon, Spokesman for PNC Corporate Communications, says, "The net effect of our staff realignment will reduce positions; however, there will be growth in certain areas and we will retain the operations center as well as regional offices in Raleigh."

They expect to add jobs in NC, including positions for Corporate Bankers, Asset Managers, and Business Bankers.

That Rocky Mount operations center will continue to operate. From that location, Mr. Solomon says that they expect to serve a number of PNC businesses — and not just those in the former RBC Bank (USA) "footprint", but PNC businesses across the US.

A Little Local History

Broughton Hospital

North Carolina is a broad state that offers everything from the beaches to the mountains and lots of interesting things in between. So if you ever decide to hop onto I-40 and head west just for grins and giggles, you might want to stop off at exit 105 in Morganton NC and see one of North Carolinas historical masterpieces that is still in operation today.

At first glance you might think Broughton Hospital's main

off to each side of the center building were staggered wards built so that each ward would have free flowing fresh air through it, along with bright sunlight and views of the grounds from all angles. All of those things were considered a cure for mental illness. An interesting fact is that many people used to think that insanity was contagious, hence the need for fresh air. The hospital is still in operation today, so don't expect to get a tour of the building's interior, but you can drive through the grounds.

Back in the early 1900s the Western North Carolina Insane Asylum was the place to go for dance socials on a Saturday night. The first superintendant of Broughton Hospital was Dr. Patrick Livingston Murphy who was from Sampson County NC. He and his wife Bettie and their family lived in the Center building until the good doctor's death in 1907.

The building has a gothic look to it and many people wonder if it could be haunted. The hospital is over 125 years old and has tunnels running underneath that used to serve as a way to move patients from ward to ward out of the public eye. Several of the old wards are closed off and the empty windows are dark and frightening to some. One nurse who worked there for almost 17 years on the night shift has written two books about paranormal events that took place there while she worked there. She also documented stories that co-workers told her. If you are interested in reading about Broughton Hospital's hauntings, go to www.hauntedbroughton.com or Amazon.com to obtain a copy. For now, Broughton Hospital is safe from destruction because it is on the national register of historical buildings. But if you are ever in the Morganton NC area, you owe it to yourself to see the hospital that once defined the meaning of "Moral treatment" in the care of NC's insane population.

building, known as the "Avery Building" has the architectural structure of a castle. But in all actuality, it is what once was considered a treatment for mental illness. Yes, the building's structure itself was a medical treatment in the fight against insanity.

Designed by Dr. Thomas Story Kirkbride and subsequently called "Kirkbride Buildings," these immense structures were built on a Linear Plan. There was a big center building, and

Cervical Cancer: Your Best Protection is Early Detection

January 2012 is Cervical Health Awareness month Approximately 400 women in NC were found to have cervical cancer last year, and 127 died from the disease. January is Cervical Health Awareness month and the focus is on raising awareness of the importance of prevention and screening for cervical cancer.

If it is detected early, cervical cancer is one of the most treatable cancers. A Pap test offers the best opportunity to find cervical cancer at an early stage, when successful treatment is likely. A Pap test is a quick and simple, generally painless test that finds abnormal cell changes in and around the cervix that can develop into cancer. Regular Pap tests can detect these changes before they have a chance to turn into cancer.

Despite the success of Pap tests in finding and preventing cervical cancer, not all women get Pap tests regularly. Low rates of screening and poor follow-up after an abnormal Pap test may increase rates of death from Cervical Cancer. It has been estimated that as many as 80% of deaths from cervical cancer could be prevented by regular screening and necessary treatment.

To start the year right, women are encouraged to schedule a Pap test to check for cervical cancer. The American Cancer Society recommends that women, who have been sexually active for at least 3 years or are over the age of 21, talk to their health care provider about being screened. Cervical Cancer can be prevented and treated. Schedule your Pap test today.

The Wilson County Health Department offers Pap test screenings and participates in the NC Breast and Cervical Cancer Control Program (NC BCCCP). Hours of operation are Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday from 8am-5pm and Thursday from 8am-7pm. Please call today to schedule a Pap test appointment.
