## Solar Power Plants Coming to Eastern NC

Solar energy offers communities a sustainable, renewable power source as well as work for local contractors. Solar farms designed to capture this energy are springing up across North Carolina. In 2011, two farms opened in Western NC. At least two more farms are in the works for Nash and Franklin Counties.

The Sandy Cross Solar Project is one such project, with a goal to build a 1.5-megawatt solar power plant across from Sandy Cross Vineyard in Elm City (between Rocky Mount and Wilson). The Sandy Cross Solar Project represents a \$5Million local investment, bringing together Sandy Cross Vineyards, O<sub>2</sub>energies of Cornelius, the Nash County economic development, and the Rocky Mount Chamber Of Commerce. When completed, this Nash County solar farm will produce enough energy for over 200 average homes. Energy generated by the solar farm will be fed into Progress Energy’s electrical grid for use by local homes and businesses.

Sandy Cross Vineyard grows organic muscadine grapes. Their plan is for the solar farm to generate energy to offset power they use in growing grapes, and power used by their related Old North State Winery.

The developer and owner of the Sandy Cross Solar Project is O<sub>2</sub>energies. Along with general contractor Southern Energy Management, the Nash County Gateway Partnership, and local chambers of commerce, O<sub>2</sub>energies is working to maximize local workforce opportunities for subcontractors. In the Elm City area, there are plans for selected subcontractors to attend a training session at the local community college.

Says Joel Olsen, Managing Director. “We expect these projects to bring work opportunities for contractors and individuals in this area who may have never worked on a solar project before.”

O<sub>2</sub>energies is also the developer and owner of Mayberry Solar Farm, a Mount Airy solar farm that began generating power October 2011, and Avery Solar, a plant constructed on Henderson Farms near Grandfather Mountain.

O<sub>2</sub>energies’ sustainable energy projects continue moving beyond their Mount Airy, Newland, and Nash County efforts with a pending project in Franklin County. A recent public notice described a State Environmental Policy Act review of an application filed for a Certificate to construct a 4.4 megawatt Solar Photovoltaic Array in Franklin County. As of February 27th, *Progress Solar 1* in Bunn was pending, awaiting a final decision from the Zoning Board.

## A Little Bit of History Cicero Culpepper Carriage Shop

It’s just after the turn of the century — the twentieth century, that is. The year is 1907 and a carriage shop has just opened at 222 Tarboro Street West in Wilson. Horses and mules draw wagons through the streets, hauling people and goods, and the shop and its blacksmith are a necessity. The Cicero Culpepper Carriage Shop served residents of Wilson and surrounding areas until 1925, when the mules, horses, and wagons were replaced by automobiles and trucks.

Looking at the well-preserved building today, it may be difficult to imagine the original wagon entrance. The surrounding tobacco warehouses, livery stables, and machine shops are gone, but the building still stands — including the second story added around 1913. A Wilson Historic Property marker adorns the building.

The building was used as a bicycle shop for a while, and then restored in the 21st century. Today it houses *Creations by Culbreth*, its doors opening for customers more than 100 years after its original doors opened for carriages and beasts.

## Can You Hear the Crack of the Bat?

March brings warmer weather and the beginning of Spring. Birds are singing, people are working in their yards, and bats can be heard making contact with pitched baseballs in stadiums across North Carolina.

Spring training is under way. Just as the kids in the neighborhood are heading out to play ball, players are practicing too — back at the stadiums preparing for the new season.

The Carolina Mudcats move from Double-A to High-A minor league baseball for the 2012 season. Their Home opener is April 6th (7:15pm) at Five County Stadium in Zebulon. The Mudcats play in the *Carolina League* this year, with many new short-distance games for fans who like to watch their Away games.

A little further down 264, head to Historic Fleming Stadium in Wilson to show your support for the Wilson Tobs. The first Tobs Home game is May 29th (7:05pm) against Petersburg. The Wilson Tobs are a wood-bat collegiate summer team, and they play in the *Coastal Plain League* where college players get to show off their skills.

Watch for some special games for both of these local teams in 2012. The Mudcats play an Exhibition Game against the Cleveland Indians the afternoon of April 3rd. This exhibition is at Five County Stadium. Then, the Tobs host the Coastal Plain League All-Star Game on July 22nd. The All-Star Game is being held at Fleming Stadium.

Although these special games are a month or more in the future, tickets will go on sale in advance and you can start planning to spend time with your family at these special ball games in addition to the regular season games!.

St. Patrick and His Day

If asked to name a well-known holiday in March, you might think of the first day of Spring. Take a drive around town, though, and you'll see restaurants and businesses adorned in green, shamrocks, and St. Patrick's Day specials!

St. Patrick's Day is celebrated on March 17th, and commemorates Saint Patrick, one of the patron saints of Ireland. A patron saint is a saint who is regarded as an advocate in heaven for a place or people. Patron saints are believed to be able to intercede on behalf of those they represent. Saints often become the patron saints of places where they were born or had been active in their lifetimes.

Patrick's life details have been lost to history, though what is known points to his being born in Roman Britain in the 300s, being kidnapped at the age of sixteen by Irish raiders, and taken captive to Ireland as a slave.

While in Ireland, Patrick dreamed that he was told by God to flee captivity and return to Britain. He did, and upon his return he joined the Church and studied to be a priest.

Around the year 432, Patrick said that he was called back to Ireland to minister to the Irish. Irish folklore tells that Patrick used the shamrock to explain the concept of the Trinity to the Irish people. Some legend also credits Saint Patrick with banishing snakes from the island.

After thirty years working in Ireland, it is estimated that Patrick died on March 17th in the year 461. The color green and shamrocks became associated with St. Patrick's Day, and have been since the 1600s when displaying shamrocks and wearing green clothing became the tradition.

St. Patrick's Day is believed to have first been celebrated in America in 1737. The first New York City Saint Patrick's Day parade occurred in 1766. Today, many US cities hold Saint Patrick's Day parades and stores hold sales to draw in customers. Will you wear green?
