Riding on the Breeze

Look toward the sky along Route 96 from Zebulon to Youngsville, or Route 39 around Bunn, and any day of the week there might be more than clouds and birds to see; sky gazers may also spot a colorful hot air balloon or two floating lazily by.

On March 11th, with the wind coming out of the South, three balloons launched from "Field of Dreams" airport on Route 96 near Zebulon. The choice to launch from Field of Dreams was made based on the wind conditions and direction. The hot air balloons launch from different locations — Zebulon, Bunn, Youngsville, and others — with pilots setting the flight plan based on the way the wind blows.

Meet Pilot Tom Tomasetti of Above & Beyond Hot Air Balloon. Tom has

flown hot air balloons in this area for almost 23 years. A certified pilot, Tom and his team of hot air balloon pilots have viewed Eastern Wake and Franklin Counties from the air thousands of times.

Each of their balloons can carry up to 4 people or a total of 600 lbs. Sometimes, Tom says, he sometimes flies with as few as two passengers who just want to take a ride. Adults may charter a flight for two or more; flights are weather dependant, and occasionally rescheduling must be done due to weather. For families, there is a lower rate for 16 and under, so you can bring your teens along. While children six to ten may fly free, their weight still counts in the 600 lbs maximum. So many people want to take a ride — for business, for celebrations, for romantic occasions — that often there is a waiting list.

Tom says that while the ride itself may vary from an hour to an hour and a half, the entire balloon adventure takes up to four hours from launch — always around 2-1/2 hours before sunset — until passengers are returned to their cars. Since they only fly in good weather, passengers can count on a beautiful view as they ride comfortably on the breeze.

Landing spots are plentiful because of this area's agricultural activity: the balloons can set down into one of many open fields. Passengers are then unloaded and ground-based transportation (called "chase vans") takes them back to the launch site where the adventure ends.

"It's quiet up there," Tom says. "There is no sensation of height or movement."

This writer questioned Mr. Tomasetti's description. He absolutely swears that in a hot air balloon everyone — even someone who doesn't like heights — can comfortably enjoy the ride and the amazing view of Wake and Franklin Counties.

So the next time that you turn your eyes on the sky, you might just see Tom or one of his pilots taking a group for a ride. Maybe you'll even see an Editor for *The Grey Area* drifting by! With a little prompting, I might brave the trip to find out for myself: if even a person who likes their feet on the ground can enjoy some quiet moments above the trees.

From Railroads to Highways: The Bunn Story

Bunn NC, located at the intersection of NC Highways 98 and 39 in southeastern Franklin County, is a small town with a fascinating history stretching over two centuries. Historical records indicate that Poplar Springs Baptist Church was founded in the area now sometimes referred to as "Old Bunn" in 1788.

The name "Bunn" comes from one of the area's earliest settlers, Green Walker Bunn. Bunn was born in 1788 in Wake County, but moved to what is now Franklin County at the age of 50. Upon his death in 1851, his 1000-acre estate was Bunn Depot 1915. Source: Don Mitchell divided among his wife



Polly and their 10 children. "Old Bunn" was given to son Elias. In the fall of 1901, store owner James Weathers was appointed Postmaster and the new postal community needed a name. Weathers' store was the local hangout, and legend says that the store's regulars settled on the name of "Bunn" to recognize Green Walker Bunn's historic role.

The turn of the 20th century brought changes to the small but growing community. The Montgomery Lumber Company (MLC) of Buffalo NY came to the area in search of a steady supply of pine timber for the wooden boxes and crates they manufactured. In 1906, MLC began to construct the Montgomery Lumber Company Railroad, which soon stretched from Spring Hope to Bunn. A private telephone line used for dispatching shipments ran beside the railroad.

Soon the MLC Railroad offered passenger and freight service to Bunn six days a week. It was the railroad which caused the town to shift from "Old Bunn" to its present site, sometimes labeled "New Bunn". Railroads were generally built on the highest available terrain to avoid track washouts during heavy rains. The need for higher ground prompted MLC to build the railroad in the newer part of town, and most businesses soon followed.

In 1909 the North State Development Company of Rocky Mount came to Bunn and had the present site surveyed into lots and streets. The same year on October 29th, people flocked to Bunn as the lots were auctioned by American Realty and Auction Co. of Greensboro and Suburban Realty and Auction Co. of Raleigh. The Franklin Times reported that this event drew "the largest crowd that had assembled in the little village in many years." Just two weeks later, the Times reported that "things have been getting a move on in Bunn. A number of prospective enterprises are beginning to take shape."

The Bunn Bank opened in 1915; two years later it merged with the Farmers & Merchants bank of Louisburg. The bank failed in the Depression years of 1929-1930, as did a number of other local businesses. The construction of state highways 39 and 98 helped to turn things around, but eventually led to the demise of the railroad. The MLC line was discontinued in 1979 and the tracks removed one year later. The 70-plus years of railroad life in Bunn had come to an end.

Twenty-first century Bunn, managed by a Mayor and four Commissioners, boasts a population of nearly 400 with several small businesses. Town staff includes a police department, and a volunteer fire force was organized in 1959. From a one-room log-built schoolhouse with a roof of sticks and dirt built in Antebellum days, the town's educational opportunities now include an elementary, middle, and high school, as well as a branch of the Franklin County Library, all within 1 mile of the town limits. The town's Web site (www.townofbunn.com) boasts that Bunn is where "descendants of Green Walker Bunn still walk down Main Street," making the town one of eastern North Carolina's rural gems.

The Bad News... Gas Prices

Gas prices continue to rise. Over the past month, pennies have been added almost daily to the price of gas. Several times, prices have risen so quickly that drivers have seen a nickle or more added to the price-per-gallon between fillups. Currently, prices in the area are running in the \$3.70 to \$3.90 per gallon range, though with some checking around, prices below \$3.70 can still be found in Eastern NC.



Within a few short weeks Eastern NC will be past the last frost date and windowsill seedlings will join the seed sprouting in the warm soil outdoors. What was seed in February and March will quickly become part of a green growing landscape. With some warm sunshine, good soil, just the right touch of water and nutrients, each gardener's plants will become a resource — a source of fresh food.

For those who choose not to garden, farmer's markets across the area are preparing for their Opening Days. Soon fresh fruits and vegetables grown across the state will be for sale in local farmer's markets. Check county government sites or www.ncfarmfresh.com to find farmer's markets close by.

Planting By the Moon: Fact Or Folklore?

We've all heard that the moon controls the tides, but when we should plant our crops?

"Lunar gardening is the oldest form of gardening known to man. Ever since prehistoric times, long before man ever had a watch on his wrist or a calendar on his wall, everything was governed by the phases of the moon," said RJ Harris, the head gardener at a private estate near Cornwall, England, and author of a book on the subject.

I have always had a passing interest in the Old Farmer's Almanac because my Granddaddy and my Papa always had it around. Both did some farming but by the time I came along their farming had been reduced to what they called "a garden". By today's standards it would have been considered more of a "farmette". Both maintained a large area of land dedicated to various vegetables and fruits which all we grandkids were recruited to help with at times on weekend visits. Helping consisted of watering tomatoes, digging potatoes, picking beans, or shuttling garden implements. Although I might have grumbled here and there because it interfered with my playing time, I realize now it was the beginning of my life-long love affair with gardening.

In the evolving quest to improve my gardening skills, I subscribe to email alerts from none other than The Old Farmer's Almanac, a bit more technical way of garnering information than picking up a yearly copy at the Feed Store. Last week I happened upon an email that completely piqued my interest titled, "Gardening by the Moon", so I decided to do a little more research.

The premise suggests that all above-ground vegetables should be planted from the day the moon is new through the day the moon is full (Waxing), and below-ground vegetables should be planted during the day after a full moon 'til the day before a new moon (Waning). It is also suggested that the light from the new moon until the full moon affects growth of seed and transplants for above-ground vegetables. Additional resources suggest that seeds that have a short germination period and an extra-long germination period of one month go in the ground two days before the new moon; long germinating seeds go in the ground at the full moon and up to seven days after, with transplants being the opposite.

Further research suggests that it is actually the differences in moisture of the soil during lunar phases that is affected by gravitational pull on groundwater tables — just like ocean tides. The premise being during the Waning phase the groundwater tables have dropped to their lowest reducing the moisture in the soil and making the ground easier to break or till. Breaking and tilling during this time also means the weed seeds are more dormant and have less moonlight on which to thrive. During the Waxing phase, considered to be the most moist and fertile, the seeds have a "tide" created in them along with the additional water created by the lunar forces which assists bursting their coating. This combined with additional light and magnetic field during the Waxing phase helps provide optimal seed conditions.

In 2010 a team comprised of geographers and climatologists from Arizona State University (ASU), Tempe, and the National Climatic Data Center (NCDC) in Asheville, North Carolina released a report in Geophysical Research Letters to confirm that "rain follows the full and new phases of the moon" based on comprehensive data compiled since 1895.

Whether it's the gravitational pull of the moon's phases affecting groundwater tables, or the rain following the full and the new phases of the moon as suggested in the latest report, this gardener is going "old school" like my Granddaddy and my Papa used to do. I'm relying on The Old Farmer's Almanac to guide me on my various crops. First up, I will put the theory to test with Leeks this year, a crop I've had zero success with in the past.

In case you're wondering what The Old Farmer's Almanac suggests: April 4th for the Rocky Mount NC area is recommended for plants that need to go in after danger of frost has passed. If you read the fine print on that, it's not a forecast but based on historical data.

I'm including details (below) and the link to *The Old Farmer's* Almanac website on which I have found a multitude of helpful information. I'll keep you posted on my Leek developments. In the meantime, Happy Gardening from your Whistle Stop Gardener.


