Downtown Updates Revitalize Local City

There is a new look in Rocky Mount and it's right downtown. After years of planning and months of blocked streets, the first phases of the Downtown Streetscape Project are almost complete — with new brick sidewalks, fresh pavement, old-school street lamps it is just about ready for the upcoming holiday season. Parking adjustment from angled to parallel allows for on-street parking next to the widened pedestrian sidewalks.

Dozens of businesses have weathered the storm of closed streets, broken pavement, loud noises, and most of all slowed commerce. This Fall, take a drive down Main Street and see what you're missing.

The updated downtown holds a variety of attractions: furniture stores, a newly restored theater, eateries, antique stores, and an arts center — all accessible within a few minutes' walk around downtown.

Says business owner and resident Hilarie Vetere, "The Arts are alive and well in downtown Rocky Mount, and will play a factor in the continued renovation."



License Granted for Wilmington Uranium Enrichment Plant

First-of-a-Kind Facility Licensed by NRC to Make Laser Enrichment of Uranium a Reality

On September 25, GE Hitachi Nuclear Energy's (GEH) Global Laser Enrichment (GLE) announced receipt of its license from the US Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) to build a ground-breaking laser enrichment facility on the 1,600-acre site of the company's global headquarters in Wilmington.

The license enables GLE to build a first-of-its-kind uranium enrichment facility using lasers conceived of by Australian technology company SILEX and developed by GLE experts. The company has worked with the NRC, the US Departments of State and Energy and independent nonproliferation experts for several years to ensure the security of this technology.

"Receiving our NRC license is a tremendous accomplishment and strong testament to everyone involved in this project," said Chris Monetta, president and CEO of Global Laser Enrichment. "The technology we've developed could be one of the keys to the nation's long-term energy security. At a minimum, it could provide a steady supply of uranium enriched right here in the U.S. to the country's nuclear reactors."

The next step in the process is for the company to make a commercialization decision. This decision will be based on several factors.






