A Little Bit of History

Cascine Mill, Louisburg NC

The Cascine Mill offers a unique opportunity to preserve an excellent example of NC’s Antebellum industrial past!

Located on a beautiful site overlooking the scenic Cedar Creek and just a few miles from downtown Louisburg, the two remaining dwellings could be restored as residences once again.

Directly off US 401, the mill and thirteen scenic acres were carved out of the vast Cascine Plantation tract to ensure its preservation. An imposing three stories, the mill is clad in weatherboard with a metal-covered gable roof on a full stone foundation. Simple in design, the mill is an exceptional example of quality craftsmanship and material.

Owned and operated by the family, the mill served a large and productive farming area. The parcel includes a mid-19th century tenant house and miller’s house, remains of the stone dam, and a race system. Each building requires a comprehensive rehabilitation and may be eligible for historic preservation tax credits.

This historic property is priced at \$88,000 for a buyer ready to make a difference to this gem of the Louisburg area.



Miracle League Field Construction Progress

The Miracle League of Franklin County is constructing Miracle Field in Youngsville. With a baseball field, field house and walking trail, the facility is being built to accommodate children with special needs, making sports participation easier for many area children.

The Miracle League of Franklin County is a baseball league for children with physical, cognitive and/or emotional disabilities. Their new field is at Long Mill Elementary School in Youngsville. When completed, it will have a T-ball sized baseball field with a rubberized turf surface to accommodate children with special needs, an all inclusive, wheel chair accessible playground, a 1600 sq. feet field house, and a 0.8 mile walking trail.

year. Ongoing fundraising is making the field possible. It will be utilized by NC Miracle Kids of Franklin, Vance, Granville, and Warren counties.

The Strange-ness

Accused Witches Executed

Look on a map a little north of Australian, and you’ll find the island of New Guinea. The eastern half of the island is the Independent State of Papua New Guinea. Papua New Guinea recently exploded with local activities against witchcraft, leading recently to the beheading of two women for practicing sorcery.

The police attempted to calm the crowd and rescue the women from torture and beheading, but were outnumbered by an angry mob with sharp weapons. These beheadings are just one event in a series recently where people — mostly women — were attacked and tortured for practicing sorcery.

Known as *Puri puri* (“black magic”), the practice of sorcery in the province continues today. The culturally diverse population speak a variety of languages and practice many religions, with most of the inhabitants practicing Christianity with some mix of local traditions.

It is unknown at this time how the actions against “witches” will be quelled in this province. Police in the Arawa settlement are searching for the executioner and his cohorts, whose names they know. It is unsure what laws may be used to prosecute the killers.

Said Kate Schuetze, Amnesty International’s Pacific researcher, “Sorcery is often used as pretext to commit violence against women. Repealing the Sorcery Act is one of the first urgent steps the authorities must take towards preventing further horrific attacks.”
