
The forum will be at 5p.m. at the church's main campus, 1740 Raleigh Boulevard, Rocky Mount.



A Little Bit of History

Michael John Smith (April 30, 1945 – January 28, 1986)

Many of us remember January 28, 1986 well. We watched on TV as the Space Shuttle Challenger destructed after lift-off. Some residents of North Carolina knew that one of their own was lost in that accident.

Mike Smith was the American pilot of the Space Shuttle Challenger. He was born in Beaufort. He died along with the six other crew members, as NASA mission STS-51L was lost. STS-51L was the twenty-fifth flight of the Space Shuttle program, using Space Shuttle Challenger. destroyed a short seventy-three seconds after its launch from Kennedy Space Center.



In addition to the Challenger Memorial in Arlington National Cemetery (see photo), there is also a Memorial in Beaufort. Additionally, the Beaufort Airport is named in memory of Smith: Michael J. Smith Field airfield.

NC Shelters and Rescues Collaborate to Save Animals and Humans from the Undead

Zombies attack humans in movies, TV shows, and Halloween attractions. The idea of brain-thirsty "undead" raises eyebrows, yet even the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) published a 2012 manual on zombie apocalypse survival. Fortunately, NC's animal groups have a solution to this ongoing fear of zombies: guardian felines.

A video released just in time for Halloween shows kittens attacking zombies, which then run from the fluffy fighters. SPCA of Wake County, headquartered on Pet Finder Lane in Raleigh, released the video October 10, 2013. Details on these special zombie-repellent cats, and a link to the video, are posted on the SPCA Wake web page: www.spcawake.org/zombies. The website states, "These cats & kittens have been trained under a top secret Romanian government project called F.A.S.T. or Feline Alert System Technology."

The video jokingly shows kittens driving tanks and armed with baseball bats. They take on the zombies and win, protecting their human owners. This tongue-in-cheek video is designed to get across a serious message about pet adoption.

To catch the attention of potential feline adopters, the SPCA Wake video builds on a zombie-repellent cat poster originally created by a Davie County animal shelter. The unique adoption promotion spread like a virus until it turned into a state-wide collaborative effort. More than 30 NC animal shelters and rescues have combined their efforts on the Halloween-themed adoption campaign.

"The SPCA has not participated in something like this before," Darci VanderSlik of SPCA Wake said. She explained that SPCA Wake is working in conjunction with many separate animal groups, to draw in adopting families for cats and kittens at shelters big and small.

To make the video, SPCA Wake utilized an army of cats and kittens who were waiting for adoption. Volunteers Chris Thomsen and Becky Lembo, along with Pet Finder Lane staffer Vanessa Budnick, put their lives at risk by dressing as zombies and facing the zombie-repellent kittens under Darci's direction.

These three may not look familiar under all that make-up, but Chris, Becky, and Vanessa also starred in an SPCA Wake video in 2011 set to the tune of ABBA's song "Take a Chance on Me". That video was viewed over 97,000 times on YouTube in two years. The Zombie-Repellent Cat video is off to a good start with over 3,800 in its first week.

What drives Darci and the team is not video production credit. They do what they do to ensure pets find homes, no matter where they are located.

"It is not just about the SPCA Wake shelter. The smaller, local shelters have amazing cats, but not the resources to reach out," says Darci. "With the zombie collaboration project, all the animal groups are sharing resources."

During the zombie promotion, the website guarantees all cats and kittens. "If a Zombie ever invades your home, we will refund your adoption fee completely. All kittens come with a certificate of authenticity from the Romanian Feline Institute."

Perhaps for a little extra donation, a kitten might come with its own specially-built tank like the one in the video? Well, probably not, but they sure do look cute driving one.

In addition to stocking up for the apocalypse, or even reading the CDC zombie survival guide, families may also want to consider about adopting a F.A.S.T. cat or kitten to help repel zombie hordes to come. Think about it... before the zombies come for brains!


