## Dr. Nicholas' Corner: Let's Talk About Anxiety

Anxiety is good for you! It is a warning sign that something in your life may not be well. The trouble is if anxiety is excessive and out of place — as it sometimes is for some people — then you have a problem. Let me explain.

Anxiety feelings, like the sense of pain, are ways of our brain to warn us to attend to something that may harm us. Here is an example: As you are ready to leave work for home, a severe snow storm warning arrives over the radio. Alarm bells ring in your brain: Do I have enough gasoline? Am I all right with no chains? etc. These thoughts that come to your mind, prompted by the anxiety/uneasiness you are feeling, spur you to take action. This is normal anxiety working for you. It energizes you to take action for your welfare.

Unfortunately, for some people, from time to time, this warning part of the brain is too easily triggered. Then a sudden feeling of severe danger, without knowing where it comes from or what kind of danger, seizes them and may cause sweating, restlessness pounding heart, and uneasiness.

Now, they may even decide to drink a beer or two in an effort to calm them down from the unpleasant state-of-mind or ask a friend to give them a blue or red pill they may have been taking. (This is not recommended, since after awhile the anxiety comes back even stronger, even worse. The colored pill may mess them up.)

Some people are more prone to anxiety attacks than others. Their temperament from birth is more social, and very sensitive leave others unfazed or more ready to endure future painful

These unpleasant "anxiety attacks" for some people may come often and to a severe degree, messing up their life, work, love life, or ability to take care of daily tasks.

Less often, these attacks may take the form of an overwhelming sense of doom and coming death! These kinds are called "panic attacks."

For sufferers these attacks made take place in specific situations, and then are given specific fancy names; like social anxiety (the attack triggered by the presence of a crowd where you have to perform), or acrophobia (while in a high place), or arachnophobia (fear of spiders), and on and on. While in a state of anxiety, sometimes the brain may try to "take care of the anxiety" — by making a person finicky, preoccupied with details, or doing rituals like pulling their hair, etc.

Sometimes anxiety may be a warning sign for physical trouble, like a coming heart attack, very low blood sugar, thyroid problem, or others.

If the problem persists, and comes back often; then, you need help. Do not let pride hold you back. Anxiety conditions are treatable. You need a good evaluation by an internist as well as a specialist like a psychiatrist. If there is a physical cause — like diabetes or a thyroid problem — it needs to be corrected.

Then counseling or psychotherapy usually is enough. If the problem persists, certain medicines against anxiety take care of the problem. The issue is that some of these medicines can be addictive and need careful monitoring. As well, they may spoil you in tolerating stress and mild challenging

## The Strange-ness

## Planet X Not Found

After searching hundreds of millions of objects across our sky, NASA's Wide-Field Infrared Survey Explorer (WISE) has turned up no evidence of the hypothesized celestial body in our solar system commonly dubbed "Planet X."

Researchers previously had theorized about the existence of this large, but unseen celestial body, suspected to lie somewhere beyond the orbit of Pluto. In addition to 'Planet X," the body had garnered other nicknames, including "Nemesis" and "Tyche."

This recent study, which involved an examination of WISE data covering the entire sky in infrared light, found no object the size of Saturn or larger exists out to a distance of 10,000 astronomical units (au), and no object larger than Jupiter exists out to 26,000 au. One astronomical unit equals 93 million miles. Earth is 1 au, and Pluto about 40 au, from the sun.

But searches of the WISE catalog are not coming up empty. A second study reveals several thousand new residents in our sun's "backyard," consisting of stars and cool bodies called brown dwarfs. The second WISE study, which concentrated on objects beyond our solar system, found 3,525 stars and brown dwarfs within 500 light-years of our sun.

The WISE mission operated from 2010 through early 2011, during which time it performed two full scans of the sky with essentially a six-month gap between scans. The survey captured images of nearly 750 million asteroids, stars and galaxies. In November 2013, NASA released data from the AllWISE program, which now enables astronomers to compare the two full-sky surveys to look for moving objects.

Despite a large number of new solar neighbors found by WISE, 'Planet X" did not show up. Previous speculations about this hypothesized body stemmed in part from geological studies that suggested a regular timing associated with mass extinctions on Earth. The idea was that a large planet or small star hidden in the farthest reaches of our solar system might periodically sweep through bands of outer comets, sending them flying toward our planet. The Planet X-based mass extinction theories were largely ruled out even prior to the new WISE study.

Other theories based on irregular comet orbits had also postulated a Planet X-type body. The new WISE study now argues against these theories as well.

Both of the WISE searches were able to find objects the other missed, suggesting many other celestial bodies likely await discovery in the WISE data.

WISE was put into hibernation upon completing its primary mission in 2011. In September 2013, it was reactivated, renamed NEOWISE and assigned a new mission to assist NASA's efforts to identify the population of potentially hazardous near-Earth objects. NEOWISE will also characterize previously known asteroids and comets to better understand their sizes and compositions.
